Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We are now in winter and temperatures fall as low as 8°C especially in the evenings. However, all the children continue to be in good health. We continue to restrict their movements and to take precautionary measures against the Covid 19.

One of the older girls was reunited with her biological father. We praise God that the father was able to find her. We cried tears of joy and sadness as she had been with KCV for 14 years.

Despite locking down the children at the Village, they have been engaged in many activities at the Village. They are engaged in the Garden and Dairy activities. The children divided themselves into groups. The girls help in the main garden and the boys at the Dairy. The children also make time to work in their family gardens and they have planted covo, rape, onions and tomatoes. Studying time is never interrupted by these activities as the children always attend to their studies at the library on stipulated times. The internet, at the library, which was installed by a local donor called Higherlife Foundation, is aiding the children in their studies. Higherlife foundation posts beneficiary information on its platform where the children are taught the word of God, gender discrimination topics, how to protect themselves from the corona virus, gender based violence among many other interesting topics which the staff also take part in.

### ***Family gardens***

In the Dairy, nine cows are being milked giving an average of 70litres a day. Children continue to enjoy milk from our dairy project and surplus is sold to Kershelmar dairies.

The garden currently has cabbages, chomoullier, beetroot which has just been planted and onions. Over 1700 bunches of carrots (15 plants per bunch) and 900kgs of butternuts were harvested and sold to the market. Some were given to the children.
